Fire Brigade News

Since last writing for the pet the brigade has attended a number of incidents. Beginning on the 2nd December to a tree over power lines in Cardigan St. Then 2 days later we were called to a fire at Sutton which was well under control and no action was necessary.

We then attended a number of flooding events on the 2nd and 3rd of January. I have nothing but sympathy for those people with businesses, buildings or homes affected by the flooding. Unfortunately given the volume of water there is little we could do. Sandbagging seldom works well and pumping water elsewhere is simply futile. I am aware that there are a number of opinions of what could be done to mitigate future events, but my feeling is the flooding was caused by phenomenal rainfall on the Rock & Pillars. Our farm has been badly affected with a number of fences and crossings washed away - the worst in over 30 years.

The brigade is looking forward to the arrival of a new fire appliance, which is likely to happen within a couple of weeks. Our current truck was built in 1986 and has been in Middlemarch for about 20 years. It has been a very good truck except that it is very slow on hills. Many times while responding to a call out towards Deep Stream we manage 30kph or less going up Kennedys Hill. Our new (not brand new) truck has been in Cromwell and I've been told it could 'fly' over the Lindis Pass (not that I am encouraging drivers to attempt a take off in a fire truck). I am hoping we will have it fully operational by the A and P Show for anyone to have a look over.

Just a reminder to all members that training will resume next Wednesday 3rd of February. A number of things to catch up on so please make an effort to attend. Commencing 1900 hrs.
