My thoughts are with the families and friends of Davy Tisdall and Peter Johnstone, it was a very hard month for the community of Middlemarch and the loss of two fantastic community people. My thoughts are with all family and friends.

A lot of different things have been happening this month which has created a bit of diversity in my work load.

I have been here 2 years now. When I first arrived I stated that there a couple of things I don't like, people lying to me, honesty goes a long way in my book and secondly drink driving. Both of these have occurred this month not making me too happy.

Along with fires becoming a hazard this month, ice has also become a problem for some. After her great achievements including representing NZ on the ice, a school skiing trip has become the undoing for this star Annelise "Abby" Coberger. While most children and parents were there to have a go at skiing or snowboarding Annelise decided this was not enough for her competitive nature. While exiting her vehicle and the excitement of years away from the winter arena she located a great piece of ice in the car park. She went about showing her kids her sporting ability and her ice skating routine in the car park. As she attempted the big finale the pirouette turned horrible wrong. With one step she ended up underneath a parked vehicle in a screaming heap of a mess. Abby Coberger's winter season was over before it started. However a bit of laughing gas she was able to find her next sport which was helicopter tours. Leaving her husband to babysit 5 children.

I have heard a lot of comments lately, 'I see that there were highway patrol vehicles hanging around town', 'the booze bus was in town' and 'I see that Jaco from Ranfurly was down in the weekend'. People have been asking me what they are doing in MY patch. I have a pretty quick and easy answer for that "Policing". Unfortunately I can't Police 24/7 and you will often see other Police in the area. When a horrible incident like this happens in a community please understand that we as Police we will do everything to try avoiding this happening again. So if you stick to the rules there will be no issues.

Also a kindly reminder that all animals must be contained inside your property and registered. I know that animals do have the tendency to go wondering. I have one that is a slow learner but we are getting there.

Also just a reminder that I have those unlawful hunting signs available for any farmer that would like them.

Fire Brigade News

Since last writing the brigade has attended five fires. On the 30th August a rubbish fire spread in to grass and stored machinery in Olive Ave. Early in the morning of the 31st, our tanker was called to assist at two fires at Lee Stream which had flared up in the strong winds and then that evening we were called to the fire on the Rock & Pillar range. This fire was in very heavy tussock country and given the strength of the wind and the inaccessible terrain there was little that could be done. Fortunately the weather changed later in the night and the fire was extinguished. On the 13th September a rubbish skip at the transfer station caught fire. Presumably by some hot ashes being dumped.

So far it has been a very windy spring. This coupled with the fact that conditions are very dry is ideal for fires to get out of control. Please take all care when lighting a fire. At the present time we are still in an open fire season, but if we don't get good rain soon, I wouldn't be surprised if fire restrictions are not put in place very soon.




